### **Local DACA: Joint Statement of IBHE, ICCB, ISAC and FIICU on Rescission of DACA**

In response to the announcement by the Trump administration to rescind the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) policy and begin a six-month wind down, the Illinois Board of Higher Education, Illinois Community College Board, Illinois Student Assistance Commission, and the Federation of Independent Illinois Colleges and Universities issued the following statement:

As organizations that work directly with students and colleges throughout Illinois, it is our shared mission to provide access to postsecondary education that not only provides a happier and more promising future for individuals and families in this state, but also drives the economic engine of Illinois.

Without Congressional action, the decision to end DACA means that Illinois students who are among the 800,000 DACA participants in the U.S. could not only lose access to education, but their lives could be upended, families could be devastated, and the state may lose some of its best, brightest and most dedicated residents.

Over 42,000 individuals have been accepted to participate in the DACA program in Illinois, including many who are currently students or have already graduated. Together we share friendships, neighborhoods, classrooms, and workplaces, including assignments with the military, proudly serving our country.
